Information for Sabbaticants

With the deadline for Sabbatical Leave Application forms upcoming, for this month's pick we wanted to detail where to find all the resources that you need for applying. - The [application form](#) and [information](#) on the Sabbatical Research Grant in Lieu of Salary. Annual deadlines for Sabbatical RGLS are November 1 for research programs commencing January 1, and May 1 for research programs commencing July 1.

It is important to note that there are currently no specific guidelines for COVID-19 and sabbaticals applicable to the upcoming academic year.

Faculty are expected to follow government and university guidelines surrounding travel and plan accordingly. Additionally, please note that in April 2021, the university and the University of Saskatchewan Faculty Association reached an agreement and signed [a letter of understanding](#) allowing Sabbatical Travel Expense Account funds to be used more broadly. This agreement was made specifically for employees on sabbatical during the academic years of 2019-2020, 2020–2021 or 2021-2022.

End Notes: Faculty Spotlight

A new partnership has been announced at USask, the Ojateki Partnership, which brings together the Gabriel Dumont Institute, the Saskatchewan Indian Institute of Technologies, and USask, along with Indigenous youth, communities, and organizations. The goal of the partnership is to transform the employment and education systems in Saskatchewan in service of Indigenous people. Read more about the partnership [here!](#)

Congrats to Dr. Bill Waiser, Distinguished Professor Emeritus in the Department of History, on his new book titled *In Search of Almighty Voice: Resistance and Reconciliation*. For more information on the book and the upcoming book launch at One Arrow First Nation, see [here](#).

A first-of-its-kind project at the Global Institute for Food Security, co-led by USask's Dr. Brian Ham of GIFS, has been awarded \$250,000 in funding plus lab time to use cutting-edge laser synchrotron technology to image live plants. The goal is to create more efficient crop breeding, with better nutrient uptake and distribution. Read more about the work [here](#) and congrats to Dr. Ham and all researchers involved!

Congrats to Dr. Gillian Muir, who was appointed as the Dean of the Western College of Veterinary Medicine for a five-year term as of July 1, 2021. Dr. Muir served as interim dean for the previous 12 months, and she is both the first WCVI graduate and the first woman to be named dean of the college. Congratulations to all faculty involved in the four USask research teams that were awarded nearly \$678,000 combined from the Canadian Foundation for Innovation. The funding will go towards equipment and labs for software analytics research, high speed heart imaging of live zebra fish, modernizing electric distribution systems, and expanding geographical information systems. Researchers at USask and the University of Calgary have discovered unusually high rates of Spinal Bulbar Muscular Atrophy, a rare neuromuscular disorder, among Indigenous peoples in Saskatchewan. The findings were published in the journal *Neurology Genetics* and can be viewed [here](#).
