CHASR is a research support and consulting service, which regularly supports and engages with academic researchers from a variety of disciplines. It was initially started within the College of Arts and Science, and has since grown to become a nationally recognized research facility. As a result, CHASR is being moved to the University Library. USask has adopted its first Sustainability Strategy, which was informed by President Peter Stoicheff's Sustainability Advisory Circle. The Sustainability Strategy commits the university to the United Nations' 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) by 2030, including reducing the university's greenhouse gas emissions by 45 per cent from 2010 levels by 2030.
