Congratulations to Dr. Julita Vassileva in the department of computer science, who is the fall convocation recipient of the annual USask Distinguished Research Award. Congratulations to Dr. Robert Henry in the department of Indigenous studies, on the publication of his new book, *Indigenous Women and Street Gangs: Survivance Narratives*. Dr. Henry co-authored the book along with six Saskatoon women who shared their stories in it. The upcoming book launch will be held on Dec. 2 in Saskatoon at McNally Robinson. Congratulations to all USask faculty and researchers at the Vaccine and Infectious Disease Organization (VIDO), which was awarded approximately \$6M from the Coalition for Epidemic Preparedness Innovations (CEPI). The award is CEPI's first to a Canadian university, and is part of their \$200M program to advance the development of vaccines that provide protection against Covid-19 variants and other coronaviruses.
