Finally, the plan to have departments, colleges, and the University develop standards for the new tenure track teaching stream has been <u>communicated</u>. While they are at it, departments and colleges are asked to provide comments on the proposed revisions to the university standards which have not been updated since 2011. After departments submit to the colleges, they will provide submissions to the URC by January 1st, and barring any major obstacles, we will have approved standards in place for the 2025/2026 academic year.
